FROM WHOM DOES THE RADIA FOUNDATION SEEK APPLICATIONS FOR ITS GRANTS?

The following criteria must be met to apply for a Radia grant:

1. The applicant must be a 501c organization (not-for-profit organization or agency) or must be applying under the auspices of such an entity.
2. The applicant must be operating in one of the 14 counties in which Radia, Inc. provides services: Benton, Chelan, Clallam, Ferry, Grays Harbor, Island, Jefferson, King, Kitsap, Mason, Okanogan, Snohomish, Spokane, Thurston.
3. Projects must be specific to women's health (especially breast health); cancer care; neurological care (especially for stroke patients); rural emergency care; or radiology research and education.

WHAT ARE THE OBLIGATIONS OF THE GRANT RECIPIENT?

1. To submit a progress report six months after receiving the grant.
2. To submit a terminal report at the end of the project.
3. To fulfill the intent of the grant within the time stated.
