Radia's Physicians Named "Top Docs" by Seattle Magazine

(Everett, Wash.) – Seattle Magazine's September issue features two members of Radia in the publication's annual listing of top physicians in the Seattle area. Lloyd Stambaugh, MD, Medical Director of Evergreen Radia Imaging Center, named a "Top Doc" in radiology, and Kaj Johansen, MD, PhD, of Radia Vascular Institute of the Northwest, in vascular surgery. This is Stambaugh's first selection. Johansen has been recognized five years in a row during the six years the survey has been in place.

The "Top Docs" are selected through a confidential survey sent to a randomized list of physicians and complementary health care providers in King County and portions of Snohomish and Pierce counties. Seattle Magazine named 385 physicians in this year's survey results.

Now in its sixth year, the list was culled from a survey sent to more than 10,000 Seattle-area physicians who were asked to name the doctors they would recommend to family and friends in 56 different specialty areas and three areas of complementary medicine, regardless of their hospital, clinic or health-plan affiliation. Those names that appeared frequently are the ones included on the final list.

"Having our physicians acknowledged by their local peers demonstrates their strong reputation in our community," says Dr. Jack Little, President of Radia.
